These courses, where legends have played, are meticulously carved from the Miami landscape to challenge, inspire and reward players of every ability.

During the next 3-5 years, Marriott Corporation will invest nearly \$10 million to renovate these five championship golf courses. Each course will be closed and renovated at specific times during this period, as Marriott sets its sites on further establishing Doral as one of the country's finest golf destinations.

Today, surrounded by green fairways and shimmering water, Doral Golf Resort & Spa is an oasis of luxury in the South Florida sun. Situated on 650 acres, with 90,000 square feet of conference and meeting space, Doral boasts a plethora of first-class amenities highlighted by the European-inspired Spa at Doral. Combining old-world charm with a thoroughly modern selection of services (including more than 100 different luxurious spa treatments, a registered dietician/ nutritionist and state-of-the-art exercise center), the Spa is recognized as one of the world's best by *Conde Nast Traveler's* Gold List.

As a golf destination specifically, Doral boasts a reputation for offering an unmatched golf experience, for golfers of all skill levels. Highlighted by five championship golf courses, as well as the acclaimed Jim McLean Golf School, Doral is truly one of the most unique, luxury one-stop-golfing experiences in the country today. Now, however, through the commitment of Marriott, including the course renovations, increased equipment investments and additional manpower, Doral's golf operation will stand among the best in the world. The courses will be fantastically conditioned, the services will be impeccable and the experience first-class.

Few golf resorts today boast the diversity or quality offered at Doral, and even fewer offer such a golf experience on property. DORAL'S FIVE CHAMPIONSHIP GOLF COURSES

- **The Blue Monster Course**

Home of the Ford Championship at Doral, the Blue Monster has hosted the prestigious PGA Tour event for the past 40 years. Originally designed by Dick Wilson, and later restored by Raymond Floyd, the Monster features long fairways, undulating green, a deep Bermuda rough and a formidable assortment of water hazards and bunkers. The famous 18th hole, with its signature fountain, is one of the most recognized finishing holes in golf.

- **The Great White Course**

A three-time winner at Doral, Greg Norman designed this innovative 148-acre course in 2000. The desert-style layout blends strategically demanding fairways, tightly-packed coquina sand, thousands of palm trees and 222 Scottish-style pot bunkers. Water is a factor on 14 of 18 holes. The course was host to the PGA's Franklin Templeton "Shoot-Out" in 2000.

- **The Gold Course**

PGA Tour legend Raymond Floyd recently redesigned this course to follow a traditional Florida layout, incorporating gently contoured greens, strategic bunkering and water surrounding 16 holes. The course features narrow, tree-lined fairways and finishes with a dramatic par-4 island green on the 18th hole. This course hosted the 1999 PGA Qualifying School finals.

- **The Silver Course**

Breaking away from a Florida-style layout, golf legend Jerry Pate redesigned the Silver Course to include narrow, rolling fairways, raised tee boxes and elevated greens. Water comes into play on 16 holes, which include a diverse mix of short and long holes throughout the course. The course, which features a signature 14th hole island green, hosted the 1999 PGA Qualifying School finals.

- **The Red Course**

The Red Course forces golfers to use strategy and shot placement, rather than driving for show. Featuring 14 water holes with fairways winding around several lakes, the course provides breath-taking beauty and exhilarating challenges, without intimidating length. This course hosted the LPGA in 2001 for the Office Depot Championship.

JIM MCLEAN GOLF SCHOOL

Located next to Doral's expansive driving range, the Jim McLean Golf School offers everything from private lessons to group clinics. Few instructors in the game today are as acclaimed as Jim McLean, who was voted No. 3 by his peers in Golf Digest's ranking of America's 50 Greatest Teachers. In addition, McLean, who has a regular instruction program on The Golf Channel, is regarded one of the PGA's Top 3 National Teachers, and has appeared on more covers of Golf Digest in the last five years than any other instructor.

As a golf resort, Doral and its five championship golf courses are complemented by a complete activity-centered destination, as the 650-acre resort offers best-in-class service and amenities for everything from a weekend golf getaway, to a luxury golf vacation, corporate golf outing, or a first-class golf instructional program. What makes the golf experience at Doral even more unique is that the resort is conveniently located just 10-minutes from Miami International Airport and 20-minutes from the exotic adventure of world-renowned South Beach.

As part of its ongoing commitment to enhancing the Doral golf experience, Marriott Golf, the company's golf management division, has assumed responsibility for the golf operations at Doral. Marriott Golf currently operates 47 golf courses at 37 facilities, offering more than 800 holes of championship golf in the U.S., Central America, the Caribbean, Europe and the Middle East.
